As part of Ampol's energy transition strategy, we are continuing to explore opportunities to reuse remediated land at the terminal, including a grid scale battery. We will provide further information and consult with the community in the preparation of the Environment Impact Statement.

Importantly, our staff and contractors will continue to remain focused on operating safely especially during the upcoming holiday period.

Terminal project updates

Wharf drain: relining of a stormwater pipeline and pits has commenced and work is scheduled to be completed by mid 2024. Stormwater upgrades: work has commenced to provide increased protection against the potential impact of stormwater. This will include new pump stations, additional stormwater retention capabilities and a levee wall around the waste-water treatment plant.

Odour mitigation: project work to mitigate potential odours from the northern gasoline tanks will commence in 2024. More information will be provided early next year.

Terminal beautification: we recently planted over 100 trees on the perimeter of the right of way on Captain Cook Drive and on the corner of Captain Cook Drive and Solander St. These trees will improve the presentation of terminal operational areas.



Ampol Kurnell Community Fund

We would like to thank all the community groups and organisations who applied to the Ampol Kurnell Community Fund.

Our objective is to make a meaning contribution to local projects or initiatives that improve amenity and positively impact the lives of Kurnell residents.

The following applicants have been successful in securing project funding.

Kurnell Catamaran Club: Upgrades to the door entry and exit infrastructure to improve access and egress, and new emergency exit lighting to enhance safety for members and the community.

Kurnell Outrigger Canoe Club: Funding towards the purchase of a new racing canoe that will build capacity to increase community participation and membership growth, while assisting with health and wellbeing outcomes.

Kurnell Stingrays Junior Rugby League Football Club: Refurbishment of the existing gym area to provide a safer environment for members. New equipment will cater for a broader range of ages, abilities, and will assist in the development of the club's registered female players.

Out of School Hours (OOSH) – Kurnell Public School P&C: Implementation of building repairs to improve the safety of the OSSH front deck, and to assist develop new policies and procedures to ensure the sustainability of the service.

Kurnell St James Anglican Church / Community Centre: Accessibility improvements including the construction of a new pathway to link the main building to external bathrooms, landscaping and building maintenance.
