Heart Start Kurnell

To help build a safer and more prepared local community, Ampol is proud to announce the Heart Start Kurnell initiative.

Heart Start Kurnell is in response to a recent medical emergency in the area and highlighted the need for more accessible defibrillators and the importance of knowing how to provide CPR. We hope to equip residents with both the tools and knowledge needed to act quickly in an emergency.

The first public access defibrillator has been installed out the front of the Kurnell Post Office. The next unit will be located at the whale watching platform at Cape Solander in the Kamay Botany Bay National Park (Kurnell).

Community CPR training courses, in partnership with St John Ambulance NSW, will also be made available. These courses will be open to Kurnell residents, with costs being fully subsidised by Ampol to encourage participation.

The community CPR courses are being held at the Kurnell Stingrays clubhouse at Marton Park and will commence on the following dates:

Session 1 – Monday 2 June 6:00p.m. – 8:30p.m.

Session 2 – Monday 16 June 6:00p.m. – 8:30p.m.

Terminal siren

Our siren is tested everyday at 12noon with a 1 x 10 second blast, and 2 x 10 second blasts on Mondays.

In the event of a major incident that has potential to impact the community, Ampol will provide initial alerts and information via its community notification platform. Residents are advised to always follow any direction from emergency services.
